### Requirements for the paper

**Heading:** title, full name(s) of author(s), and place of work with full address including fax and email address, each on separate line. Title should be concise but informative, and where appropriate should include mention of family or higher taxon's name.

**Abstract:** The Abstract must be written in English. The abstract summarizing the contents of the paper and indicating the relevance of the work should not exceed 30 lines. Adopt standard scientific nomenclature, and avoid abbreviations and quotations. Abstracts of taxonomic papers should mention all nomenclatural acts and list newly proposed nominal.

**Key words:** The abstract should be followed by less than 8 key words (index terms). The key words should be complete (i.e., words from the title should be repeated if considered index terms). A short running title should be provided under the key words.

**Organization of a manuscript:** The standard order of sections for original papers is: Abstract, Key words, Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions (the latter two sections may be combined), Acknowledgements and References. The original paper should not exceed 8 pages including illustration and tables.

Manuscripts should be typed with double spacing on A4 sized paper, Microsoft Office 2007, title 14 pt **Bold**, CAPITAL LETTER, subchapter 12 pt **Bold**, manuscript's letter font Times New Roman 12 pt. To use "Equation" inserting mathematic and statistic formulation, 10 pt, **Bold**, *Italic*.

*The Introduction* should not provide a review of the area of work, but should introduce the reader to the aims and context for the work described. *Materials and Methods* should be sufficient to allow work to be replicated, but should not repeat information described fully elsewhere. *The Results section* should be restricted to a factual account of the results obtained and the text should not duplicate information given in the Tables and Figures. *The Discussion section* should include a concise statement of the principal findings, a discussion of the validity of the observations, a discussion of the findings in the light of other published works dealing with the same subject, and a discussion of the significance of the work. *Conclusions section* may be created and it should include only shortly concluding remarks of obtained results. *Acknowledgements* of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section before the References.

References: *References* should be cited in the text as follows:

One author: Aoki (1990) or (Aoki, 1990);

Two authors: Beck & Woas (1993) or (Beck & Woas, 1993);

More than two authors: Norton et al. (1993) or (Norton et al., 1993).

All publications referred in the text (including synonymical lists of taxonomic papers) must be listed in full in the list of references in alphabetical order. Put authors in alphabetical sequence, with multiple papers of the same author arranged chronologically. Cite all authors and full title. Do not capitalize authors' names. Abbreviate names of periodicals basically according to the World List of Scientific Periodicals, 4th Edition, Butterworths, London, 1964-1965.

#### Illustrations and Tables

*Illustrations* (including graphs) and their caption or legends should form a separate, fully self-explanatory unit. Explain abbreviations in the legends, or (if too numerous) collect them elsewhere in a list (preferably under Material and Methods). Clear, technically perfect line drawings are accepted. Use good-quality black Indian ink, and do not use very fine lines or dots in drawings that are to be significantly reduced. The original drawings should be not more than twice as large as when printed, and may be arranged into blocks or plates not larger than the typescript. Black-and-white glossy photographs are best submitted at the actual size of reproduction. Morphological illustrations (if not schematic) must include a scale bar. Use pre-printed lettering of sufficient size to permit reduction; never produce lettering on an ordinary typewriter.

*Tables* should include headings and explanations, and should be numbered consecutively. Their approximate position in the text should be indicated in the margin. When preparing illustrations and tables, please consider the printed page dimensions: width 160 mm, height 240 mm, column width 75 mm. References in the text to illustrations and tables: Fig. 1; Figs. 1-2; Table 1. Use italic as follows: In the text: Latin names of taxa up to the generic level. In the References: names of periodicals and titles of books (but not the Latin names of taxa). If you cannot use italic, mark the text to be set in italic with a simple underline.
